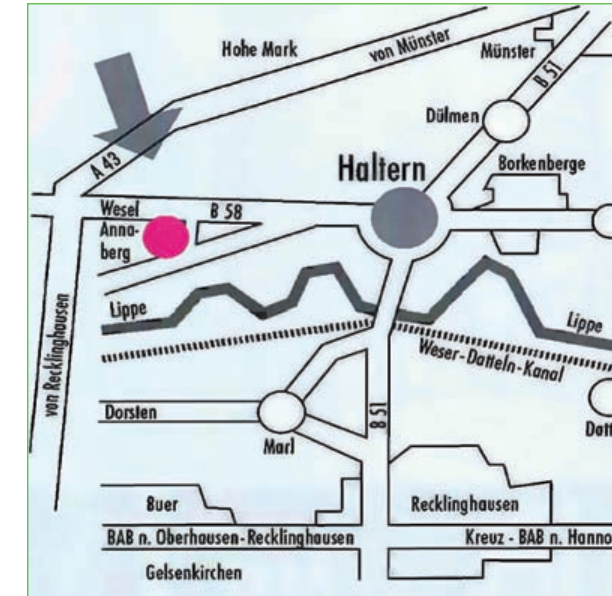

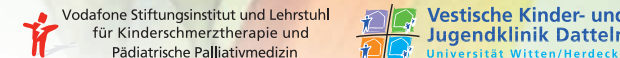

International Multi-Professional Paediatric Palliative Care Course

Care structures for Paediatric Palliative Care (PPC) are rapidly progressing throughout Europe. Recent changes in education and laws have led to profound improvements in the care of the children and their families. However, the structures of PPC differ between and within the European countries. It is therefore the aim of the first International Course to learn from each other. This entails learning from the very advanced European countries as well as learning from those countries that have just started to introduce PPC in their country. Following the tradition of Thomasz Dangel who organised the "European Courses on Paediatric Palliative Care" in the years 1999, 2001 and 2003 we aim to achieve significant improvements in the PPC structures throughout Europe. With this course we want to make first steps into a European standard of PPC which may be an example for the PPC structures worldwide.

Participants

Professionals (nurses, paediatricians, psychologists, social workers, ministers) working in PPC, preferably members of a multi-professional PPC team.

Caution: Limited to a maximum of 90 participants. We encourage multi-professionalism, i.e., participants from a single team representing different professions are preferred.

Aims of the course

- Offering professionals the opportunity to share and discuss knowledge with experts in Paediatric Palliative Care
- Enlargement of the European network in paediatric palliative care including countries which are just building up PPC teams.
- Improvement of PPC in Europe to achieve an effective support for the affected child and his/herfamily.

Setting

The course is conceptualized as a multi-professional course inviting professionals in PPC to attend. Multiprofessionalism enables each participant to increase his/her knowledge in the broad field of PPC. We therefore encourage the teams to send members who represent the diversity of the respective PPC team.

In addition, all participants will stay at the sameaccommodation closely allocated to the course venue.

The course consists of plenary sessions and workshops. We have built up a didactic concept that enables active participation and discussion according to didactic standards.
